The Austin A30 (initially called the A30 'Seven' to deliberately make connections with the highly successful pre-War Austin Sevens) was introduced in October 1951 and was the first all-new compact post-War Austin saloon, featuring a unitary construction body shell (the first Austin this constructed), independent front suspension and a new 803cc overhead valve engine. This was the forerunner to the long-running 'A' Series units used by Austin/Morris from 1956, and later by BL and Rover.

At the time it was a thoroughly modern design, and the A30, plus the 948cc A35 developed from it (and that arrived in 1956) provided many individuals and families with cost-effective, practical and reliable motoring. Indeed many are still used daily, seven decades down the line!

As well as two and four door saloon variants (built until 1959 when the Mini and the A40 Farina came along), commercial van versions continued until 1968 (with 1098cc or 848cc engines in later models). In addition, there were fully-trimmed 'Countryman' estate A30s and A35s, plus an A35 pick-up, built in very small numbers.

Any of these Austins can provide an enjoyable ownership experience, with a 'fun' factor out of all proportion to the compact size of the vehicles - although this is helpful for garaging/accommodating the cars. Once in sound condition they are easy to maintain, practical to operate and economical on fuel. Owners also find that these Austins attract genuine affection and interest wherever they are driven today.
